

## Community Resource Credit Union recognized by state Rep. Smith

Community Resource Credit Union was honored in a resolution on the House floor by State Rep. Wayne Smith for its 75 years of service to the city of Baytown and vital role in the local economy.

“For three-quarters of a century, Community Resource Credit Union has provided its members with a range of financial services, making it a valued contributor to the welfare and prosperity of Baytown,” stated Representative Smith.

The event, which was held in the Texas Capitol Building in downtown Austin on Thursday, March 31, and featured D.E. “Doug” Osterhus, chairman of the CRCU board, David Frazier, president/CEO of CRCU, Ronnie Anderson, executive vice president, and CRCU board secretary-treasurer D. Wayne Gray and also the vice chairman of the board, Randall Sanders.

CRCU officers and board members were treated to a warm welcome by legislators from both parties, as they expressed appreciation to CRCU “for being such a positive presence in the financial services industry, especially during these challenging economic times.”

The resolution also praised CRCU for its overall role in Baytown and Crosby. David Frazier, president/CEO of the credit union, thanked legislators for “honoring the spirit and efforts of CRCU.” Frazier continued “We are dedicated to supporting our community by providing jobs for over 100 employees, making over \$50,000 in donations annually to local organizations and paying members over \$7 million dollars in dividends over the last two years.”

Originally formed by a group of Humble Oil employees in 1935, Community Resource Credit Union is the oldest locally owned financial institution in the Baytown area.

Presently, CRCU is open for membership to anyone who lives, works, or attends school within the boundaries of the Goose Creek, Crosby, Barbers Hill, Huffman, Humble and New Caney Independent School Districts; and all businesses operating within the same boundaries.
